

12.12.050 Playing ball on streets. No person shall, within the city, play at a game of ball, or throw a ball from one to another, upon any street, alley, thoroughfare, or at a railway station or ground contiguous thereto. (Prior code §8-113).

12.12.060 Washing vehicles on street. It is unlawful for any person, directly or indirectly, to wash or clean any motor vehicle on any of the public streets of the city. (Prior code §8-114).

12.16.010 Established. There is established a uniform system for numbering buildings fronting all streets, avenues, and public ways in the city, and all houses and other buildings shall be numbered in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. (Ord. 4216 §1, 1981).

12.16.020 Base line--Locations. New Madrid Street extended northerly and southerly shall constitute the base line for numbering buildings along all streets running easterly and westerly and Malone Avenue shall constitute the base line for numbering buildings along all streets running northerly and southerly. (Ord. 4216 §2, 1981).

12.16.030 Base line--Numeric intervals. The numbering of all buildings on each street shall begin at the base line. All numbers shall be assigned on the basis of twenty-foot intervals. (Ord. 4216 §3, 1981).
